BACKGROUND

Founded in 2018, Empower 7 is a Christian faith-based organization created for the sole purpose of empowering the lives of vulnerable, underserved youth in North Texas. Love for all of God's children is the foundation for our ministry and is the driving force behind our vision, **“All youth, regardless of their circumstance, to become thriving, purposeful adults who are driven to make the world a better place.”**

Our Christ-centered ministry is guided by our shared values:

- **Mission Driven:** Genuine passion for our mission is at the core of each person.
- **Authentic:** Achieving our mission is dependent on trust – trust from donors, partners, volunteers and clients. To earn and maintain trust, we ensure our actions align with our words and our operations are open and transparent.
- **Tenacious:** Impossible is not in our dictionary. We know that to make a difference in this world, we must have unwavering perseverance, diligence and discipline to our long-term impact plans.
- **Together:** We are best together. When individuals connect with others of a shared purpose, the impossible is possible.

Empower 7's mission is to provide strategic life solutions to empower the lives of vulnerable youth.

THE NEED

More than 400,000 children are in foster care on any given day, and the number of children without placement has skyrocketed over the last few years. The foster care system is overwhelmed with more children entering the system than kinship caregivers, foster families, or group homes can adequately support.

- **Risk of Being Unadopted** – More than 20,000 youths in foster care “age out” every single year in the United States without reunification with their families or placement in a permanent adoptive home.
- **Risk of Being Homeless** – Tragically, over 20% of the teens who “age out” of foster care become homeless immediately.
- **Risk of Being Uneducated** – Only 69% of foster youth transitioning out of foster care receive a high school diploma by age 21.
- **Risk of Being Incarcerated** – 36% of youth transitioning out of foster care were incarcerated by age 17.
- **Risk of Being Abused** – Without a loving home, at-risk youth have a higher likelihood of experiencing trauma, abuse, neglect, and hardships that have lasting consequences.

OUR CALLING

Jesus commands us to love our neighbors as ourselves. For Empower 7, that means to love our young neighbors that are in the foster care system – foster care teens and aged-out youth that are struggling to navigate young adulthood on their own.

Empower 7's calling is to empower youth by

- **Providing a safe place** – Residential community on a ranch setting that provides a safe place to live.
- **Offering strategic programs** – Programs to positively address the physical, cognitive, moral, psychological, social, emotional, and spiritual aspects of youth development.
- **Making Jesus Known** – Christ-centered environment to light their way to the unconditional love of Jesus

Our services will benefit vulnerable youth, ages 13-24, who are:

- In need of emergency placement following a crisis or homelessness
- Unable to successfully thrive in a traditional foster home
- Transitioning out of foster care
- At risk of becoming disconnected due to traumatic experiences, neglect, developmental disorders, significant barriers/disparities, lack of parental structure in the home

IMPACT STRATEGY

A critical component in empowering vulnerable youth is to build the Empower 7 Ranch: a safe, serene residential community for at-risk youth that need a safe place to call home. The residential community will provide a home-base for at-risk youth to live, programs to help the teens successfully complete their high school education and develop critical life skills, resources to aid students who wish to pursue higher education, and personal growth curricula that will enable each individual to pursue happy healthy adult lives.

Guided by the E.M.P.O.W.E.R. 7-Step Model, our programs will bring life-changing solutions in a Christ-centered environment.

- A stable and loving place to call home
- Food, clothing, and essentials
- Healthcare, self-care, and therapy for healing and restoration
- Bible-based guidance to learn about Jesus and Christian values
- Recreational & social activities to enjoy community & God's creation
- Tutoring to supplement academic and vocational learning
- Career support and cooperative work programs for self-sufficiency
- Life skills training for independent living and healthy relationships
- Mentoring programs for building integrity and life-long support

Strategic life solutions to empower their lives.



THE RANCH

The Empower 7 Ranch, lovingly referred to as “the ranch”, will be located on a multi-acre, serene property in the North Texas area. The desired property will be 150+ acres with trees, open fields, sandy loam soil for horses, and natural water sources.

Our vision for the ranch design includes:

- Large ranch homes for foster care teens ages 13-18
- Small cottage homes for aged-out foster youth ages 18-24
- Horse arenas, stables, barns, pastures, and riding trails
- Community hub with recreation hall, family lounge, dining hall
- Education center and workshops for education and career readiness
- Administrative buildings and staff housing
- RV/trailer parking/facilities
- Chapel and prayer garden
- Retreat/respice cabins and campgrounds
- Outdoor spaces for recreation and social activities and enjoyment of God’s creation

LIGHTING THEIR WAY

Lighting Their Way is Empower 7's campaign to raise funds to build the Empower 7 Ranch and to develop the E.M.P.O.W.E.R. 7-Step Model. Spanning over many years, the campaign initiatives are strategically grouped into five development milestones for achieving the long-term vision of the ranch. Milestone 1 involves building the foundational infrastructure critical for offering effective residential services. Milestones 2-5 involve expanding the ranch infrastructure for community engagement, enriched outreach, extended learning, and retreat/respice services. Currently in Milestone One, we are focused on developing residential service plans and the E.M.P.O.W.E.R. 7-Step Model and program curricula, designing architectural plans, and fundraising for the land and ranch homes.

PROGRESS IN REVIEW

Since 2018, Empower 7 has been faithfully working to create solutions to help vulnerable youth become thriving adults. Program services were launched to support at-risk teens in North Texas. Fundraising and outreach events were hosted to raise awareness for our ministry's calling and funding for our programs and capital campaign. Architectural plans for the ranch and cottage homes were designed to meet the residential needs of youth that will live at the ranch. Architectural design concepts were developed to communicate our vision for the ranch. We continue to develop the E.M.P.O.W.E.R. 7-step model and build the donor and volunteer base. With joy and eagerness, Empower 7 pursues our mission goals and prays for God's direction and provision in everything we do.

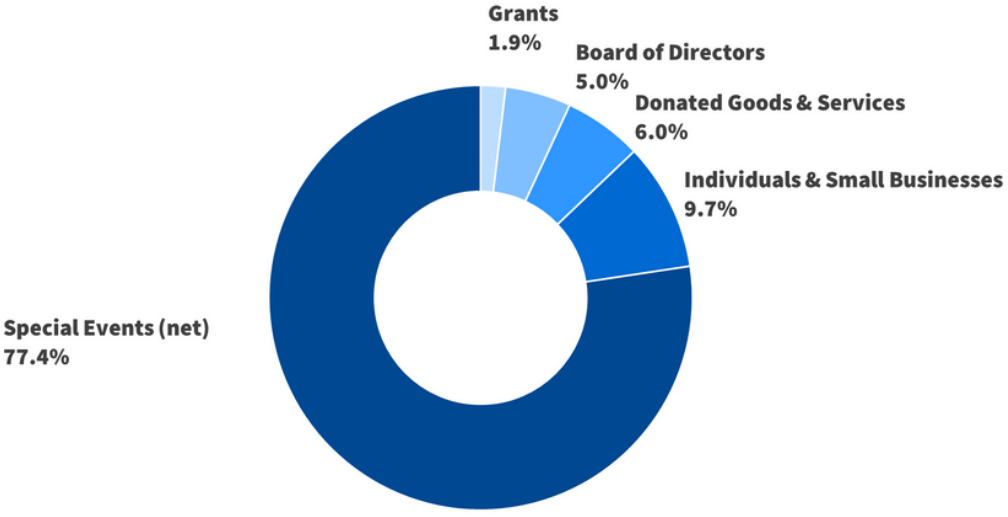

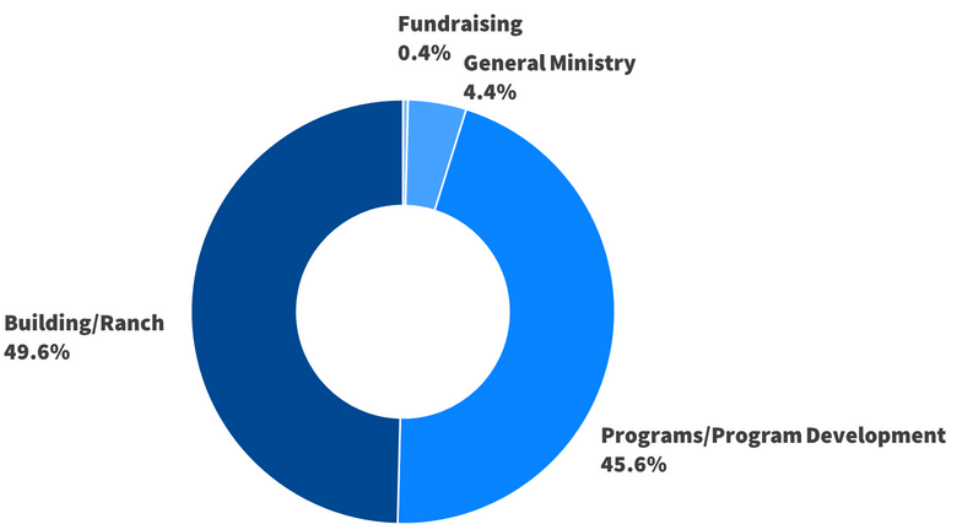


2023 FINANCIALS

Through Project Self Esteem, we provide at-risk teens with grooming supplies, feminine hygiene products, socks, undies, and other items needed for personal care. CHRISTMAS BLESSINGS

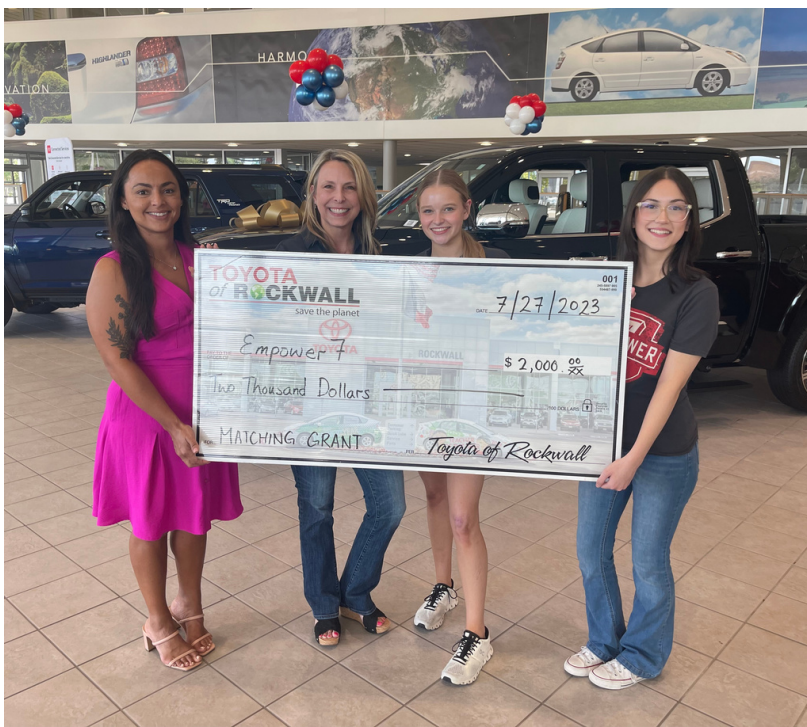

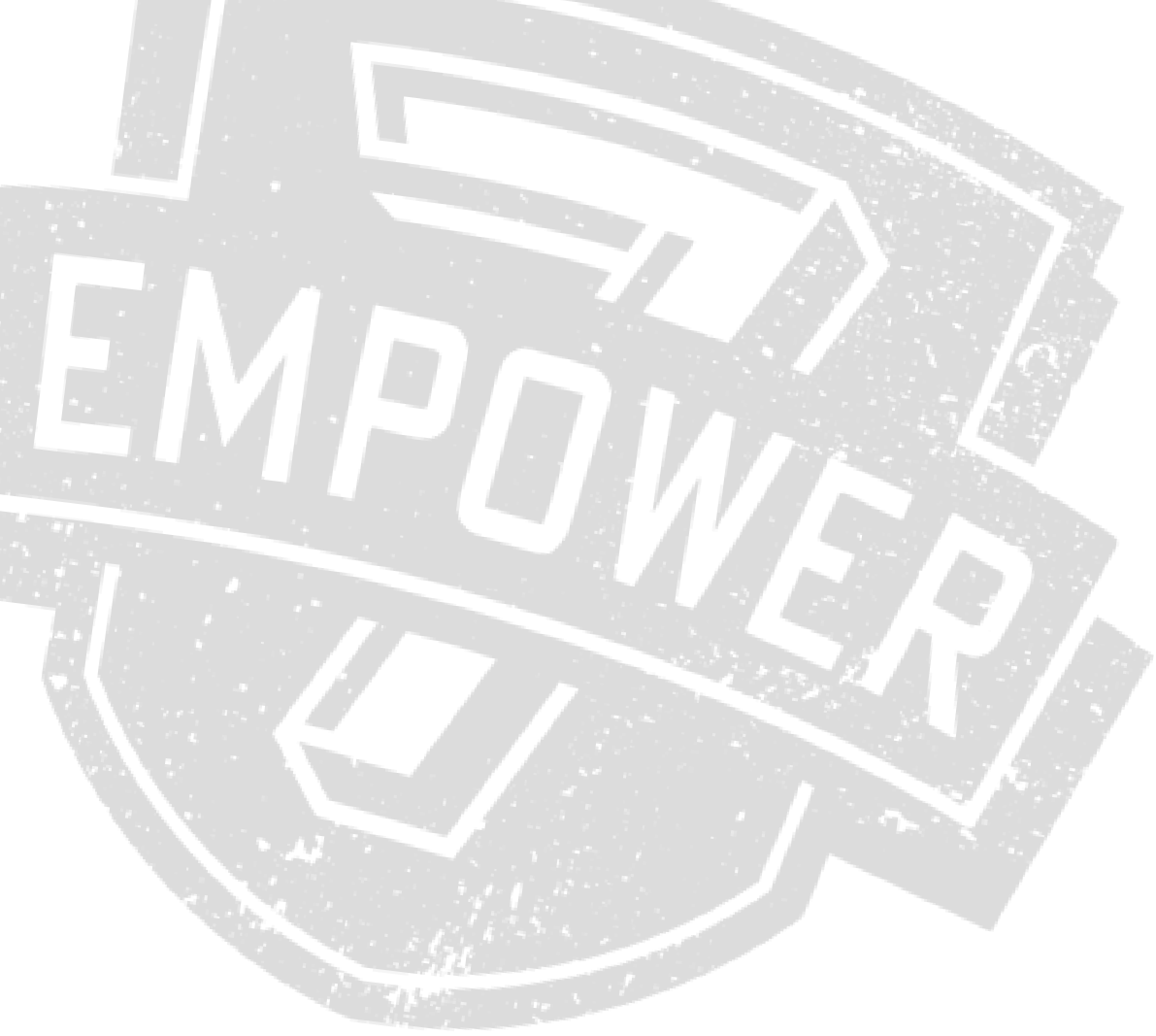
